BIO's:

John Williams:

Williams joined SCHA in 2018 from Palmetto Health (Prisma Health,) South Carolina's largest healthcare system. He has more than 12 years of experience in healthcare emergency management, serving in leadership positions in engineering, safety, emergency management, and life safety at healthcare facilities prior to joining SCHA. At Palmetto Health, among other duties, he was responsible for the Hazmat team composed of 16 members, incident commander and chairman of the Environment of Care Committee.

At SCHA, he serves as an advisor and information resource, offering one-on-one support to members, such as helping emergency managers prepare for Joint Commission reviews, and serving as liaison for personal membership groups for engineers and emergency managers. He is a member of the Governor's Task Force for Public Health Emergencies and works with SC DHEC, the SC Emergency Management Division and other state agencies in preparing for statewide crises, such as hurricanes.

Williams holds a double major Bachelor of Science degree in Occupational Safety and Health and in Environmental Engineering and a Master of Science degree in Organizational Leadership and Healthcare Management from Waldorf

University in Forest City, Iowa. He is a certified hospitals safety professional, certified emergency safety professional and certified electrician.

Williams, a native of Buffalo, NY, lives with his wife and two daughters in Columbia, SC.

Tracy Fasolino:

Dr. Fasolino strives to advance healthcare research and evidence based practice throughout South Carolina and beyond to improve the quality of life of patients, caregivers, and healthcare teams. She was selected for the 2021 Cambia Sojourn's Scholar Leadership Cohort to build a national platform on palliative care needs for residents and providers, as well as educating policy makers on key aspects related to rural health. She is a board certified Hospice & Palliative Care Nurse Practitioner and Family Nurse Practitioner with over 25 years of experience working with inpatient and outpatient teams. As an educator and advocate, she focuses on sharing her knowledge and skills at all levels of the interdisciplinary team on the value of palliative care using her embedded Palliative Care (ePC) model. Her area of research is unmet needs for patients with chronic, non-cancer illness with a focus on end-stage pulmonary conditions. She teaches at the Doctoral & Master's level on advanced pharmacology, acute episodic adult illnesses, and healthcare finance and policy. She has received numerous grants and has published a number of manuscripts focusing on palliative care needs. She is regularly invited to present at regional and national conferences on a number of topics, including rural health issues in pulmonary patients, engaging in goals of care conversations, and initiating advance care planning. She welcomes the opportunity to expand networking and build collaboratories with the South Carolina Society of Chaplains to bring greater awareness of ongoing rural health initiatives on the benefits of spirituality in cases of serious illness.
