



2024 Resources and Metrics Guide

The Certified Zero Harm Clinical Awards, the cornerstone of our Zero Harm program, recognizes hospitals that prevent all hospital-acquired infections of a specific nature over extended periods of time. Thanks to a collaboration with The Duke Endowment and The Joint Commission Center for Transforming Health and ongoing support from BlueCross BlueShield of South Carolina, our member hospitals have continually united on statewide efforts to create a culture of high reliability and reduce harm in our facilities by implementing robust, evidence-based practices that are making a positive impact on patients and the safety and quality of care. The data for these awards is independently certified and validated by the SC Department of Public Health (SCDPH) in a unique third-party verification process using NHSN data. Awards can be earned by having zero harm in the clinical area for the 12-month period starting January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023. The award application portal will be open from **Wednesday, August 14, 2024 - Friday, September 27, 2024**. The eight categories for this year are:
